




# EVERY DAY AT SCHOOL COUNTS

School absenteeism and truancy can impact significantly on students learning and wellbeing.

Research shows that in Queensland, higher student attendance is associated, on average, with higher student achievement.

Additionally, attending school every day helps children to build social and emotional skills such as communication, teamwork and resilience.

Under the law, you must make sure your child is enrolled and attends school on all school days unless there is a reasonable excuse. Schools must monitor attendance of students and follow up with parents and caregivers with any unexplained absences.

If your child does not want to go to school, or is missing school without you knowing, contact your school immediately for assistance and support.

#### Schools will:

- Monitor student attendance
- Notify you if your child has unexplained absence as soon as practicable on the day of your child's absence sand continue to follow-up with you as practicable
- Use effective teaching strategies to engage your child in learning
- Help you with strategies to encourage your child to go to school
- Provide support for families.

# Preventing and managing snake bites.

Snakes come out of hibernation during the warmer months and may find quiet shelter at your school/workplace whilst the site has been vacant over weekends or holiday breaks. Cool, dark protected areas such as under buildings and near sheds, around rubble, stored materials and in long grass are typical areas that snakes may be found. As with all Australian native animals, snakes are protected under the Nature Conservation Act 1992 (Qld) and cannot lawfully be killed or taken from the wild and held in captivity. Never attempt to catch or kill a snake - snakes are not usually aggressive and do not seek confrontation with humans, but may retaliate if provoked.

Call for a professional snake catcher as snake bites can easily occur if inexperienced people interfere with snakes.
