- Increase the percentage of students achieving a 'C' standard or above in English, Mathematics and Science from 79% to 90%.
- Improve teacher capacity to successfully implement all learning areas in the Australian Curriculum incuding general capabilities.
- Empower staff and develop staff skill to build resilence and self awareness and monitoring in students.
- Ensure that 100% of staff confidently participate in collegial engagement processes to ensure the development of effective teaching practice.

Our initiatives include

- Implementing Hattie's high yield strategies of direct instruction (effect size ,59), instructional quality (effect size 1) and feedback to students (effect size 1.13).
- Embedding the culture, climate, processes and protocols of classroom observation, feedback and coaching to support professional development and lead to a change in practice to support student learning achievement (Guskey, 2002).
- Undertaking a case management approach data reviewed 10 -weekly with all staff to review progress and effectiveness of strategies (Sharratt & Fullan, 2012).
- Develop flexible learning spaces and approaches to provide learning opportunities and environments that cater for all students needs (Lippman, 2016).
